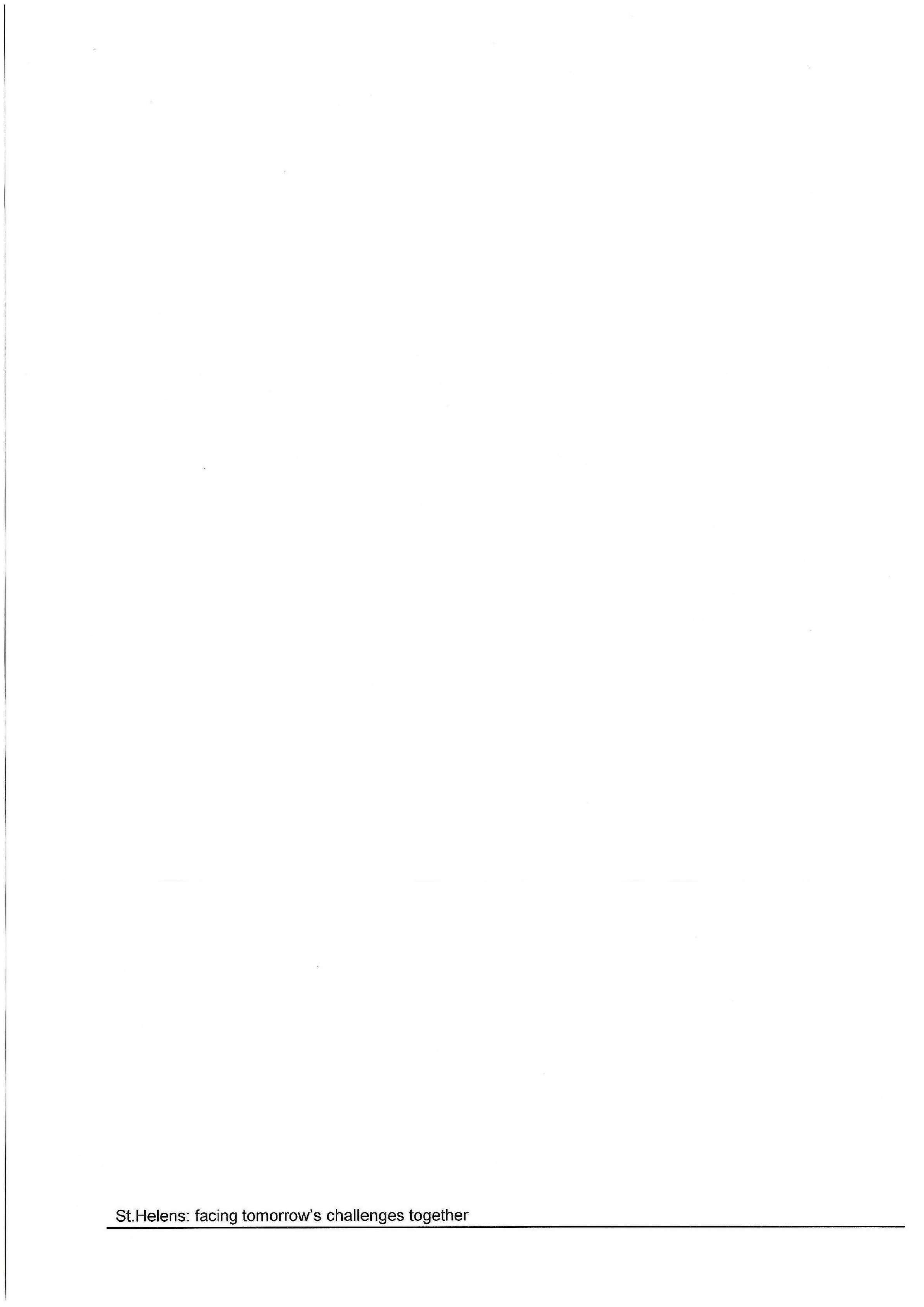

Referring to the planning application referenced above, dated 29th January 2020, regarding a hybrid planning application for the following development (major development); (i) Full Planning Permission for the erection of a B8 logistics warehouse, with ancillary offices, associated car parking, infrastructure and landscaping; and (ii) Outline Planning Permission for Manufacturing (B2) and Logistics (B8) development with ancillary offices and associated access infrastructure works (detailed matters of appearance, landscaping, layout and scale are reserved for subsequent approval) on land to the West of Omega South & South of the M62, Bold, St Helens, notice is hereby given that Highways England's formal recommendation is that we:

- a) offer no objection;

Highways England recommended Planning Conditions / Highways England recommended further assessment required / Highways England recommended Refusal.

HIGHWAYS ENGLAND ("we") has been appointed by the Secretary of State for Transport as strategic highway company under the provisions of the Infrastructure Act 2015 and is the highway authority, traffic authority and street authority for the Strategic Road Network (SRN). The SRN is a critical national asset and as such we work to ensure that it operates and is managed in the public interest, both in respect of current activities and needs as well as in providing effective stewardship of its long-term operation and integrity.

Our initial review has identified that the TRANSYT results as presented in the TA Appendix and tables in the report will be difficult, if not potentially impossible, t

To be able to interpret the TRANSYT results as presented in the TA Appendix and tables in the report we have requested a copy of the model or a detailed print of the TRANSYT network to identify arm and link references. Without this, we are unable to audit the provided information effectively.

Highways England have arranged to meet with the developer to discuss our initial findings and identify any further assessment that may be required.

Highways England therefore recommends that planning permission not be granted until 26th March 2020 to allow time for the developer to provide the further information requested and for a thorough review of the provided information to be undertaken
